

Notes from Bushfire Forum: Our Community Supporting Recovery by Peter Williams

- On 23rd February 2020 the Alpine Valley Community Leadership Inc and Susan Benedyka ran a workshop for people involved in Bushfire Recovery
- 200 people mainly from the Alpine Valleys and Upper Murray
- Information booths ACRE, Rotary, Regional Arts Victoria, FRRR, Rural Finance
 Assistance, Landcare, Wildlife Victoria, Salvation Army, Tourism NE, Gateway Health,
 North East Catchment Management, RDV etc
- Attendees were asked to write down what was working well, what needed to happen and ideas they had.
- I have synthesized the output from all of notes

Warnings

- The emergency warning information via the app was good but...
- Need for greater clarity on difference between advice, watch and act, emergency and evacuation notices.
- What's in place for those who don't access digital channels

What has worked well

- Communities self organising their initial response and relief efforts was raised 5 times
- Other events, visits from politicians and other prominent people, the amount of donations, relief centres, immediate needs being met (situational)
- Grassroots and community groups are making a visible impact. Eg Blazeaid, Rotary

What has been problematic?

- Lack of clarity of who does what (9 times)
- Bottom up approach would work best (5 times)
- Too many forms and complexity of some (5 times).
 - Suggestion: single registration that could be used across and getting help out to people with the forms, sit at kitchen table rather than getting people to come into town
- Lack of support for local and small businesses a problem (5 times)
- Difficulty in understanding what support was available (3 times)
- Issues in communities that spanned the Vic/NSW border (2 times)

Concerns

- Vulnerable people including farmers, indigenous, those having mental health issues.
- Suggestion for alternative mental health support beyond 1-on-1 counselling
- Fatigue building in the communities
- People cashed up with grants and insurance monies, may not be in the best frame of mind to use those funds wisely
- What is happening with all of the donated money? (2 times)
- What support will there be for tourism (3 times)


Resilience


- Came up a number of times. Particularly about telco and power solutions for future fire events
- Ongoing impact of climate change was also raised


Other Suggestions

- Community response on ground from outside / inside regions

GAPS

- CALD community languages

- Understanding of existing skills especially new arrivals and other vulnerable groups
- Clarity and access to Funds \$, Grants,

- We need to be thinking

- Resourcing

- GETS WORSE BEFORE IT GETS BETTER
- COMMUNITIES ON ALERT
- EMERGENCY RELIEF
 Short Term Emergency response / Medium Emergency required longer
- RENEWABLE ENERGY Rebuild it differently as not enough early
- CELL BANK Similar issues so don't recreate wheel
- TREES IN PADDOCKS (SHADE)
 Stock / Animal welfare / Restock of property
- NO RESOURSES / HUMAN RESOURCES ORGANISATIONS
 - → Interchangeable support process between Shires
 - Resource Local Council

- HOW DO YOU IDENTIFY the Mental Health Issues

- FORMING AN ORGANISATION
 Such as a collaboration of local councils to all comm's together and have common goals around planning (eg Housing etc)

 From suitably Qualified and Empathic people on the ground in an informal space (eg around the kitchen table)

HOW DO WE SUPPORT

Psychological resilience as we see more frequent intense fires

- the fear of it happening again

RECOGNIZING EXISTING NETWORKS

(eg school groups) as basis for immediate early work and capability

- SMALL BUSINESS IMPACT
 Even if not directly fire affected
- CRITERIA FOR ASSESSMENT Are the criteria for assessing impact on small business too tight / stringent?
- LOCAL GOVERNMENT & STAFF Overwhelmed
- CHALLENGE for medium to long term support
- INSURANCE
 - Some now 'CASHED UP'
 - Under Insured
 - Non Payment if not directly affected

VOLUNTEERS IN COMMUNITY ORGANISATIONS

(Managing Reserves etc) or staff in FFm Vic who have had their own properties impacted but still are serving the community

OPPORTUNITIES TO 'NETWORK'

Or streamline community organisations to make it easier for people to play their role and have support

COMMUNICATION → Isolated Communities being cut off

LONG TERM MENTAL HEALTH ISSUES

→ Need for trust & links between health & agriculture services (eg farmers do not want to call a mental health hotline)

FILLING OUT FORMS

Help is needed (so stressful) → Hubs are a good idea

LONG TERM FOCUS

Farmers will take about 18 mths just getting back on their feet and then true impact hits

DO GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS HAVE A RECOVERY ROLE?
